Mr. Thompson of Mississippi introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To designate the United States Courthouse to be constructed in Jackson, Mississippi, as the "R. Jess Brown United States Courthouse".

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) R. Jess Brown was more than an attorney;
- 6 he was a champion for justice in Mississippi
- throughout the civil rights era and among the few
- 8 black attorneys in the entire State to actively prac-
- 9 tice civil rights law.

- 1 (2) R. Jess Brown was instrumental in break2 ing barriers as the first attorney to file a civil suit
 3 on behalf of African Americans in Mississippi, as
 4 well as the attorney to file the case on behalf of
 5 James Meredith against the University of Mississippi.
- 7 (3) Brown's mission was to confront racial in-8 justice through education.
 - (4) Before deciding to pursue law, Brown trained minds as a professor at Alcorn College, and later as a high school teacher in the Jackson Public School system.
- 13 (5) In 1948, R. Jess Brown served as a plain-14 tiff in the case against the Jackson School Board for 15 fairness between black and white teachers' salaries.
- 16 (6) R. Jess Brown left an indelible legacy as ahumanitarian, educator, and attorney.
