1	SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF DATE FOR COMPLIANCE BY SMALL
2	PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS WITH MCL FOR AR-
3	SENIC IN DRINKING WATER.
4	(a) EXTENSION.—The Administrator of the Environ-
5	mental Protection Agency shall, with respect to small pub-
6	lic water systems, extend from January 23, 2006, to Janu-
7	ary 23, 2008, the effective date provided in paragraph (j)
8	of section 141.6, Code of Federal Regulations (or any suc-
9	cessor regulation), for compliance with—
10	(1) the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for
11	arsenic in drinking water of 0.010 mg/L (10
12	micrograms per Liter); and
13	(2) the related requirements specified in such
14	paragraph.
15	(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:
16	(1) The term "small public water system"
17	means a public water system that serves a commu-
18	nity with a population of not more than 65,000 indi-
19	viduals.
20	(2) The term "public water system" has the
21	meaning given to that term in section 1401 of the
22	Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300f).
