## AN ACT

To improve proficiency testing of clinical laboratories.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Proficiency Testing
3	Improvement Act of 2005".
4	SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENT OF PROFICIENCY TESTING OF CLIN-
5	ICAL LABORATORIES.
6	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-
7	retary of Health and Human Services—
8	(1) may not, during the one-year period begin-
9	ning on the date of the enactment of this Act, con-
10	duct (or cause an entity with which the Secretary
11	contracts to conduct) the proficiency testing referred
12	to in section $353(f)(4)(B)(iv)$ of the Public Health
13	Service Act (42 U.S.C. 263a(f)(4)(B)(iv));
14	(2) shall revise such proficiency testing (or
15	cause such testing to be revised)—
16	(A) to reflect the collaborative clinical deci-
17	sion-making of laboratory personnel involved in
18	screening or interpreting cytological prepara-
19	tions;
20	(B) to revise grading or scoring criteria to
21	reflect current practice guidelines;
22	(C) to provide for such testing to be con-
23	ducted no more often than every 2 years; and
24	(D) to make such other revisions to the
25	standards for such testing as may be necessary
26	to reflect changes in laboratory operations and

1	practices since such standards were prom	ul-
2	gated in 1992; and	
3	(3) shall make the revisions required by par	ra-
4	graph (2) within one year after the date of the	en-
5	actment of this Act and before resuming proficier	ıcy
6	testing referred to in such section.
