Mr. INGLIS of South Carolina introduced the following bill; which was referred
to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of entries
of certain manufacturing equipment.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN MANUFACTURING EQUIPMENT EN-**
4 **TERED ON OR AFTER MAY 11, 1997, AND BE-**
5 **FORE OCTOBER 21, 1998.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding sections 514 and
7 520 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514 and 1520)
8 or any other provision of law, not later than 90 days after
9 the receipt of the request described in subsection (b), any
10 article—

1 (1) that was entered, or withdrawn from ware-
2 house for consumption—

3 (A) on or after May 11, 1997; and

4 (B) before October 21, 1998; and

5 (2) with respect to which heading 9902.84.89 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United
7 States would have applied if such article had been
8 entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for consump-
9 tion, on December 31, 2001,
10 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if such heading
11 9902.84.89 applied to such entry or withdrawal, and the
12 Secretary of the Treasury shall refund any excess duty
13 paid with respect to such entry.

14 (b) REQUESTS.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be
15 made under subsection (a) with respect to any entry only
16 if a request therefor is filed with the Bureau of Customs
17 and Border Protection of the Department of Homeland
18 Security, not later than 180 days after the date of the
19 enactment of this Act, that contains sufficient information
20 to enable the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection—

21 (1) to locate the entry; or

22 (2) to reconstruct the entry if it cannot be lo-
23 cated.
