A BILL

To prohibit the provision of Federal funds to any entity for the construction of a Federal facility unless the entity has in effect a policy of conducting a criminal background check on an employee before allowing the employee to participate in the construction of a public elementary school or secondary school, and for other purposes.

- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Background Check for 2
- 3 Student Safety Act of 2006".
- 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

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- 5 The Congress finds as follows:
- 6 (1) The security of the Nation's schools must 7 be of the highest priority.
- 8 (2) On September 1, 2004, Chechen terrorists 9 seized a school in Beslan, Russia, and held more 10 than 1,000 students, teachers, administrators, and parents hostage for 3 days before killing 330 indi-12 viduals, including more than half of the children in the school. 13
 - (3) Reports have indicated that the Chechen terrorists may have planted weapons in the floorboards of the school during a construction project that took place over the summer of 2004.
 - (4) Workers at school construction sites have unfettered access to the school and blueprints detailing its layout.
- 21 (5) Such complete familiarity with and access 22 to the school allows an individual to gather informa-23 tion and plant weaponry that could be used in future 24 attacks, as occurred in Beslan.
