To amend the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 to require reporting of the congressional offices to which gifts are provided.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Clarity in Lobbying
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPORTING BY LOBBYISTS OF GIFTS TO CONGRES-
- 7 SIONAL OFFICES.
- 8 Section 5(b) of the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995
- 9 (2 U.S.C. 1604(b)) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (3), by striking "and" after
2	the semicolon;
3	(2) in paragraph (4), by striking the period and
4	inserting "; and; and
5	(3) by adding at the end the following:
6	"(5) the recipient and amount of any gift given
7	by a registrant or employee listed as a lobbyist to a
8	covered legislative branch official.
9	For purposes of paragraph (5), the term 'gift' means a
10	gratuity, favor, discount, entertainment, hospitality, loan,
11	forbearance, or other item having monetary value. The
12	term includes gifts of services, training, transportation,
13	lodging, and meals, whether provided in kind, by purchase
14	of a ticket, payment in advance, or reimbursement after
15	the expense has been incurred.".
