To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to limit the agri-biodiesel credit to oils produced from plants and animals.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. AGRI-BIODIESEL CREDIT LIMITED TO OILS
- 4 PRODUCED FROM PLANTS AND ANIMALS.
- 5 (a) In General.—Paragraph (2) of section 40A(d)
- 6 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (defining agri-bio-
- 7 diesel) is amended to read as follows:
- 8 "(2) AGRI-BIODIESEL.—The term 'agri-bio-
- 9 diesel' means biodiesel derived solely from virgin
- 10 oils—

1	"(A) from esters derived from corn, soy-
2	beans, sunflower seeds, cottonseeds, canola,
3	crambe, rapeseeds, safflowers, flaxseeds, rice
4	bran, and mustard seeds, and
5	"(B) from animal fats.".
6	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
7	this section shall apply to biodiesel sold after the date of
8	the enactment of this Act in taxable years ending after
9	such date.

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
