A BILL

To prohibit deceptive altering or disguising of caller identification on outbound telephone calls.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. TELEPHONE CALLER IDENTIFICATION FRAUD
- 4 PROHIBITED.
- 5 (a) CONDUCT PROHIBITED.—Not later than 270
- 6 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Fed-
- 7 eral Trade Commission shall promulgate a rule under sec-
- 8 tion 18(a)(1)(B) of the Federal Trade Commission Act
- 9 (15 U.S.C. 57a(a)(1)(B)) to prohibit, as an unfair or de-
- 10 ceptive act or practice, making any outbound telephone

- 1 call that alters, masks, or disguises, or employing any
- 2 technology to alter, mask, or disguise, the automatic num-
- 3 ber identification of the caller, with the intent to deceive
- 4 the person to whom the call is made.
- 5 (b) Definitions.—For purposes of the rule required
- 6 by this Act—

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- 7 (1) the term "automatic number identification"
 8 means the 10 digit telephone number used by a tele9 communications carrier to determine the telephone
 10 number of the calling party on any outbound tele11 phone call, such as is used to provide telephone cus12 tomers with caller identification services; and
 - (2) the term "telecommunications carrier" has the meaning given such term in section 3(44) of the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 153(44)).

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
