To suspend temporarily the duty on ethanol.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Ethanol Tax Relief
- 5 Act of 2006".
- 6 SEC. 2. ETHANOL.
- 7 (a) In General.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
- 8 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
- 9 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
- 10 new heading:

- 6 period beginning on the effective date under subsection (b)
- 7 and ending on December 31, 2006, heading 9901.00.50
- 8 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States
- 9 is not effective.

10 SEC. 3. CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY.

- 11 The Constitutional authority for this Act is the power
- 12 of Congress to regulate commerce with foreign nations as
- 13 enumerated in Article I, Section 8 of the United States
- 14 Constitution.
