## A BILL

To designate certain functions as inherently governmental, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Locks and
- 5 Lock and Dam Facilities Act of 2006".
- 6 SEC. 2. INHERENTLY GOVERNMENTAL DETERMINATION.
- 7 (a) In General.—
- 8 (1) Inherently governmental.—For pur-
- 9 poses of section 2(a) of the Federal Activities Inven-
- 10 tory Reform Act of 1998 (112 Stat. 2382), water

- and navigational resource projects and facilities, including the operation and maintenance of locks and
  lock and dam facilities, are considered national critical infrastructures and the operation and maintenance of locks and lock and dam facilities are considered inherently governmental functions that require performance by Federal employees.
- 8 (2) Transfer.—The transfer of any function 9 described in paragraph (1) to a different agency 10 shall not change the inherently governmental func-11 tion determination which requires performance of 12 such functions by Federal employees.
- (b) EXCEPTIONS.—Notwithstanding subsection (a),the Army Corps of Engineers may continue to contract—
  - (1) for private sector performance of functions related to the operation and maintenance of locks and lock and dam facilities that are performed under contracts with the private sector in effect on March 1, 2006, except that nothing in this section shall prevent the Army Corps of Engineers from using Federal employees to perform such functions in the future; and
- (2) with the private sector to construct new
   locks and lock and dam facilities.

(c) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the 1 term "operation and maintenance of locks and lock and dam facilities" includes all activities associated with oper-3 4 ation, maintenance, and repair of locks and lock and dam facilities as well as surrounding areas and associated facilities and equipment, including embankments, floodgates, spillways, outlet works, levees, pumping structures, 8 and moveable bridge spans over navigable waterways necessary for the transit of vessels; opening and closing the 10 lock gates to permit transit of vessels and giving directions to vessel pilots transiting locks; actions related to the release of water from lock and dam facilities, such as the operation of spillway gates and other outlet works, for flood control or maintenance of a navigation pool; related 14 15 to enforcement of laws, rules, and regulations on site at locks and locks with dam facilities; and contract manage-17 ment and oversight.
