 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Deep Water Royalty
 - 5 Jurisdiction Act".

2	OVER QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO ROYAL-

5	(a) Limitation on Certain Jurisdiction.—In any
6	case brought by any person other than a department,
7	agency, or instrumentality of the United States, no court
8	created by Act of Congress shall have any jurisdiction, and
9	the Supreme Court shall have no appellate jurisdiction, to
10	hear or decide any question pertaining to—
11	(1) the application of a price threshold in deter-
12	mining the volume for which suspension of royalties
13	applies under section 8(a)(1)(H) of the Outer Conti-
14	nental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1337(a)(1)(H))
15	and section 304 of Public Law 104–58 (43 U.S.C.
16	1337 note) with respect to leases awarded in the 5-
17	year period beginning on November 28, 1995; or
18	(2) the interpretation of, or the validity under
19	the Constitution of, this section.
20	(b) Certain Defenses not Available.—In any
21	case brought by a department, agency, or instrumentality
22	of the United States against any person to recover royal-
23	ties under the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act, no legal
24	or equitable defense shall be available to the defendant re-
