- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CLARIFICATION OF JUDICIAL IMMUNITY.
- 4 (a) In General.—Chapter 21 of title 28, United
- 5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 6 lowing:
- 7 "§ 464. Judicial immunity for administrative func-
- 8 tions
- 9 "(a) In General.—Subject to subsection (b), each
- 10 justice or judge of the United States and each justice or

- 1 judge of a State shall have immunity against any Federal
- 2 civil cause of action arising from or as a result of the dis-
- 3 charge of any legislatively or constitutionally authorized
- 4 duty, unless such justice or judge, in the course of dis-
- 5 charging such duty, was committing a crime.
- 6 "(b) Other Immunity.—This section shall not pre-
- 7 empt any Federal or State law providing immunity in ad-
- 8 dition to the immunity provided by this section.".
- 9 (b) Chapter Analysis.—The chapter analysis for
- 10 chapter 21 of title 28, United States Code, is amended
- 11 by adding at the end the following:

"464. Judicial immunity for administrative functions.".
