# A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Secretary of Education, acting jointly, to make grants for community outreach programs to empower patients and health care consumers, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Patient Empowerment
- 5 and Education Act of 2005".

#### 1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 2 The Congress finds as follows:
  - (1) Preventable medical errors cause as many as 98,000 deaths each year in hospitals, according to the Institute of Medicine.
    - (2) There are currently many safety procedures in place to be followed by medical professionals in hospitals and other medical facilities to prevent medical errors, yet 42 percent of Americans still say they have personally experienced a medical error.
    - (3) One way to address the issue of increasing medical errors and medical malpractice suits is to empower patients and health care consumers, thereby curbing litigation and reducing medical errors that cost the economy as much as \$29 billion annually, half of which consists of health care costs.
    - (4) According to the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, the best way to prevent medical errors is for an individual to be an active member of his or her health care team.
    - (5) Educating patients and health care consumers about applicable safety procedures and policies and about standards of care will help to reduce medical errors.

## SEC. 3. GRANTS TO EMPOWER PATIENTS AND HEALTH 2 CARE CONSUMERS. 3 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Secretary of Education, acting 5 jointly (in this Act referred to as the "Secretaries"), may make grants to nonprofit organizations for community 7 outreach programs to empower patients and health care 8 consumers. 9 (b) Use of Funds.—The Secretaries may make a 10 grant to an organization under this section only if the or-11 ganization agrees to use the grant for a community out-12 reach program to empower patients and health care con-13 sumers, including by— 14 (1) educating patients and health care con-15 sumers about their role in making health care safer 16 for themselves and their families, including through 17 the use of public service announcements and patient 18 safety workshops; 19 (2) educating children about their role in mak-20 ing health care safer for themselves, including 21 through the use of outreach programs in local school 22 systems; and 23 (3) supporting victims and family members af-24 fected by medical errors, including through the use

of counseling and peer support services.

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- 1 (c) Authorization of Appropriations.—To carry
- 2 out this section, there are authorized to be appropriated
- 3 such sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006 and

4 each subsequent fiscal year.

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
