Mrs. CHRISTENSEN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the suitability and feasibility of establishing the St. Croix National Heritage Area in St. Croix, United States Virgin Islands, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ST. CROIX NATIONAL HERITAGE AREA STUDY.**

4 (a) **SHORT TITLE.**—This section may be cited as the
5 “St. Croix National Heritage Area Study Act”.

6 (b) **STUDY.**—The Secretary of the Interior, in con-
7 sultation with appropriate State historic preservation offi-
8 cers, States historical societies, and other appropriate or-

1 ganizations, shall conduct a study regarding the suitability
2 and feasibility of designating the island of St. Croix as
3 the St. Croix National Heritage Area. The study shall in-
4 clude analysis, documentation, and determination regard-
5 ing whether the island of St. Croix—

6 (1) has an assemblage of natural, historic, and
7 cultural resources that together represent distinctive
8 aspects of American heritage worthy of recognition,
9 conservation, interpretation, and continuing use, and
10 are best managed through partnerships among pub-
11 lic and private entities and by combining diverse and
12 sometimes noncontiguous resources and active com-
13 munities;

14 (2) reflects traditions, customs, beliefs, and
15 folklife that are a valuable part of the national story;

16 (3) provides outstanding opportunities to con-
17 serve natural, historic, cultural, or scenic features;

18 (4) provides outstanding recreational and edu-
19 cational opportunities;

20 (5) contains resources important to the identi-
21 fied theme or themes of the island of St. Croix that
22 retain a degree of integrity capable of supporting in-
23 terpretation;

24 (6) includes residents, business interests, non-
25 profit organizations, and local and State govern-

1 ments that are involved in the planning, have devel-
2 oped a conceptual financial plan that outlines the
3 roles of all participants (including the Federal Gov-
4 ernment), and have demonstrated support for the
5 concept of a national heritage area;

6 (7) has a potential management entity to work
7 in partnership with residents, business interests,
8 nonprofit organizations, and local and State govern-
9 ments to develop a national heritage area consistent
10 with continued local and State economic activity;
11 and

12 (8) has a conceptual boundary map that is sup-
13 ported by the public.

14 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 fiscal years after the
15 date on which funds are first made available for this sec-
16 tion, the Secretary of the Interior shall submit to the Com-
17 mittee on Resources of the House of Representatives and
18 the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the
19 Senate a report on the findings, conclusions, and rec-
20 ommendations of the study.

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
