- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Polluter Accountability
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT.

- 8 TIONS.—Section 309(c)(1) of the Federal Water Pollution
- 9 Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1319(c)(1)) is amended—

- 2 "\$5,000";
- 3 (2) by striking "\$25,000" and inserting
- 4 "\$50,000"; and
- 5 (3) by striking "\$50,000" and inserting
- 6 "\$100,000".
- 7 (b) Criminal Penalties for Knowing Viola-
- 8 TIONS.—Section 309(c)(2) of the Federal Water Pollution
- 9 Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1319(c)(2)) is amended—
- 10 (1) by striking "\$5,000" and inserting
- 11 "\$15,000";
- 12 (2) by striking "\$50,000" and inserting
- "\$250,000"; and
- 14 (3) by striking "\$100,000" and inserting
- 15 "\$500,000".
- 16 SEC. 3. REFUSE ACT OF 1899.
- 17 Section 16 of the Act of March 3, 1899 (33 U.S.C.
- 18 411), relating to penalties for violations of the provision
- 19 of law popularly known as the Refuse Act of 1899, is
- 20 amended by striking "\$25,000" and inserting "\$75,000".
