## A BILL

To amend section 5202 of the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004 to provide for assured funding for more Border Patrol agents.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ASSURANCE OF ADEQUATE FUNDING FOR**  
4 **MORE BORDER PATROL AGENTS.**

5 Section 5202 of the Intelligence Reform and Ter-  
6 rorism Prevention Act of 2004 (Public Law 108–458) is  
7 amended—

8 (1) by striking “In each of” and inserting the  
9 following:

10 “(a) IN GENERAL.—In each of”;

1           (2) by striking “shall, subject to the availability  
2           of appropriations for such purpose,” and inserting  
3           “shall”; and

4           (3) by adding at the end the following:

5           “(b) ASSURED FUNDING.—For each of fiscal years  
6           2006 through 2010, the Secretary of the Treasury shall  
7           make available to the Secretary of Homeland Security the  
8           amount the Secretary of Homeland Security determines  
9           is necessary to carry out subsection (a) for such fiscal  
10          year. Each such amount is available, without fiscal year  
11          limitation, to carry out subsection (a).”.
