A BILL

To modify the provision of law which provides a permanent appropriation for the compensation of Members of Congress, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Congressional Pay for
5 Performance Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF PERMANENT APPROPRIATION**
2 **FOR MEMBERS' PAY.**

3 Subsection (c) of section 130 of the joint resolution
4 entitled "Joint resolution making continuing appropria-
5 tions for the fiscal year 1982, and for other purposes"
6 (Public Law 97-51; 2 U.S.C. 31 note) is amended—

7 (1) by striking "(c) Effective" and inserting
8 "(c)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), effec-
9 tive"; and

10 (2) by adding at the end the following:

11 "(2) If Congress has not passed all general appro-
12 priation bills before the beginning of a fiscal year, then
13 the appropriation contained in paragraph (1) shall not be
14 effective with respect to such fiscal year."

15 **SEC. 3. CONSIDERATION OF THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH AP-**
16 **PROPRIATION.**

17 It shall not be in order in either the House of Rep-
18 resentatives or the Senate to consider the general appro-
19 priation bill making appropriations for the legislative
20 branch for any fiscal year unless and until all other gen-
21 eral appropriation bills for such fiscal year have been pre-
22 sented to the President for signature under section 7 of
23 article I of the Constitution of the United States.
