A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to
reauthorize the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SCAAP REAUTHORIZED.**

4 Section 241(i) of the Immigration and Nationality
5 Act (8 U.S.C. 1231(i)) is amended—

6 (1) by amending paragraph (4)(A) to read as
7 follows:

1 “(4)(A) In carrying out paragraph (1), the Sec-
2 retary of Homeland Security shall give priority to—

3 “(i) Federal incarceration of undocu-
4 mented criminal aliens who have committed ag-
5 gravated felonies; and

6 “(ii) compensating States, and political
7 subdivisions of States—

8 “(I) located on a border of the United
9 States with Canada or Mexico; or

10 “(II) having one of the fifth largest
11 populations of aliens who are not author-
12 ized to be present in the United States.”;

13 and

14 (2) by amending paragraph (5) to read as fol-
15 lows:

16 “(5) There are authorized to be appropriated
17 \$750,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2006 through
18 2010 to carry out this subsection.”.
