## AN ACT

To establish a Federal Youth Development Council to improve the administration and coordination of Federal programs serving youth, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Youth Coordi-
- 3 nation Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP.
- 5 (a) Members and Terms.—There is established the
- 6 Federal Youth Development Council (in this Act referred
- 7 to as the "Council") composed of members as follows:
- 8 (1) The Attorney General, the Secretary of Ag-
- 9 riculture, the Secretary of Labor, the Secretary of
- 10 Health and Human Services, Secretary of Housing
- and Urban Development, the Secretary of Edu-
- cation, the Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary
- of Commerce, the Secretary of Defense, the Sec-
- 14 retary of Homeland Security, the Director of Na-
- tional Drug Control Policy, the Director of the Of-
- 16 fice of Management and Budget, the Assistant to
- the President for Domestic Policy, the Director of
- the U.S.A. Freedom Corps, the Deputy Assistant to
- the President and Director of the Office of Faith-
- Based and Community Initiatives, and the Chief Ex-
- 21 ecutive Officer of the Corporation for National and
- Community Service, or a designee of each such indi-
- vidual who holds significant decision-making author-
- 24 ity, and other Federal officials as directed by the
- 25 President, to serve for the life of the Council.

- 1 (2) Any additional members as the President 2 shall appoint from among representatives of faith-3 based organizations, community based organizations, child and youth focused foundations, universities, non-profit organizations, youth service providers, 5 6 State and local government, and youth in disadvan-7 taged situations. In making the appointments under 8 this paragraph, the President shall consult with the 9 Speaker of the House of Representatives, who shall 10 take into account the recommendations of the Ma-11 jority Leader and the Minority Leader of the House 12 of Representatives, and the president pro tempore of 13 the Senate, who shall take into account the rec-14 ommendations of the Majority Leader and the mi-15 nority Leader of the Senate. Each member ap-16 pointed under this paragraph shall serve for 1 term 17 of 2 years.
- (b) CHAIRPERSON.—The Chairperson of the Councilshall be the Secretary of Health and Human Services.
- 20 (c) Meetings.—The Council shall meet at the call
- 21 of the Chairperson, not less frequently than 4 times each
- 22 year. The first meeting shall be not less than 4 months
- 23 after the date of enactment of this Act.
- 24 SEC. 3. DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL.
- 25 (a) The duties of the Council shall be—

- 1 (1) to ensure communication among agencies 2 administering programs designed to serve youth, es-3 pecially those in disadvantaged situations;
  - (2) to assess the needs of youth, especially those in disadvantaged situations, and those who work with youth, and the quantity and quality of Federal programs offering services, supports, and opportunities to help youth in their educational, social, emotional, physical, vocational, and civic development;
  - (3) to recommend objectives and quantifiable 5year goals for such programs;
  - (4) to make recommendations for the allocation of resources in support of such goals and objectives;
  - (5) to identify areas of overlap or duplication in purpose and operation of programs serving youth and recommend ways to better facilitate coordination and consultation, improve efficiency, and streamline such programs;
  - (6) to identify target populations of youth who are disproportionately at risk and assist agencies in focusing additional resources on them;
  - (7) to develop a recommended plan, including common indicators of youth well-being, and assist

agencies, at the request of 1 or more agency, in co-
ordinating to achieve such goals and objectives;
(8) to assist Federal agencies, at the request of
1 or more such agency, in collaborating on model
programs and demonstration projects focusing on
special populations, including youth in foster care,
migrant youth, projects to promote parental involve-
ment, and projects that work to involve young people
in service programs;
(9) to solicit and document ongoing input and
recommendations from—
(A) youth, especially those in disadvan-
taged situations;
(B) national youth development experts,
researchers, parents, faith and community-
based organizations, foundations, business lead-
ers, youth service providers, and teachers; and
(C) State and local government agencies,
particularly agencies serving children and
youth; and
(10) to work with Federal agencies to conduct
high-quality research and evaluation, identify and
replicate model programs and best practices, provide

technical assistance, and coordinate the collection

- and dissemination of youth services-related data and
- 2 research.
- 3 (b) The Council may provide technical assistance to
- 4 a State at the request of a State to support State-funded
- 5 councils for coordinating State youth efforts.

#### 6 SEC. 4. ASSISTANCE OF STAFF.

- 7 (a) Director.—The Chairperson, in consultation
- 8 with the Council, shall employ and set the rate of pay for
- 9 a Director.
- 10 (b) Staff of Federal Agencies.—Upon request
- 11 of the Council, the head of any Federal department or
- 12 agency may detail, on a reimbursable basis, any of the
- 13 personnel of that department or agency to the Council to
- 14 assist it in carrying out its duties under this Act.

#### 15 SEC. 5. POWERS OF THE COUNCIL.

- 16 (a) Mails.—The Council may use the United States
- 17 mails in the same manner and under the same conditions
- 18 as other departments and agencies of the United States.
- 19 (b) Administrative Support Services.—Upon
- 20 the request of the Council, the Administrator of General
- 21 Services shall provide to the Council, on a reimbursable
- 22 basis, the administrative support services necessary for the
- 23 Council to carry out its responsibilities under this Act.

## 1 SEC. 6. REPORT.

2	Not later than 1 year after the Council holds its first
3	meeting, the Council shall transmit to Congress an interim
4	report of its findings, and not later than 2 years after the
5	Council holds its first meeting, the Council shall transmit
6	to Congress a final report including its findings and rec-
7	ommendations. The report shall—
8	(1) include a comprehensive list of recent re-
9	search and statistical reporting by various Federal
10	agencies on the overall well-being of youth, including
11	the ratings of the Program Assessment Ratings Tool
12	(PART) of Federal programs serving youth used by
13	the Office of Management and Budget, if applicable;
14	(2) include the assessment of the needs of
15	youth and those who serve them;
16	(3) include a summary of the plan called for in
17	section $3(a)(7)$ ;
18	(4) recommend ways to coordinate and improve
19	Federal training and technical assistance, informa-
20	tion sharing, and communication among the various
21	programs and agencies serving youth;
22	(5) include recommendations to better integrate
23	and coordinate policies across agencies at the Fed-
24	eral, State, and local levels, including recommenda-
25	tions for legislation and administrative actions;

1	(6) include a summary of actions the Council
2	has taken at the request of Federal agencies to fa-
3	cilitate collaboration and coordination on youth serv-
4	ing programs and the results of those collaborations,
5	if available;
6	(7) include a summary of the action the Council
7	has taken at the request of States to provide tech-
8	nical assistance under section 3(b), if applicable; and
9	(8) include a summary of the input and rec-
10	ommendations from the groups identified in section
11	3(a)(9).
12	SEC. 7. TERMINATION.
13	The Council shall terminate 60 days after transmit-
14	ting its final report under section 6.
15	SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
16	There is authorized to be appropriated \$1,000,000
17	for each of fiscal years 2007 and 2008 to carry out this
18	Act.
