Mr. BISHOP of Utah, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2361) making appropriations for the Department of the Interior, environment, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2006, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2361) making appropriations for

1 the Department of the Interior, environment, and related  
2 agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2006,  
3 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall  
4 be dispensed with. All points of order against consider-  
5 ation of the bill are waived. General debate shall be con-  
6 fined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally di-  
7 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-  
8 ity member of the Committee on Appropriations. After  
9 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment  
10 under the five-minute rule. Points of order against provi-  
11 sions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule  
12 XXI are waived except as follows: beginning with the colon  
13 on page 46, line 3, through “account” on line 14; section  
14 109; page 67, line 17 through the semicolon on page 67,  
15 line 22; beginning with “That” on page 68, line 23,  
16 through “and” on page 69, line 3; beginning with “That”  
17 on page 69, line 19, through the comma on line 22; page  
18 73, line 14 through line 22; section 413; beginning with  
19 “notwithstanding” on page 121, line 11, through the  
20 comma on line 12; beginning with “notwithstanding” on  
21 page 121, line 22, through “laws” on line 23; beginning  
22 with “Notwithstanding” on page 124, line 6, through line  
23 7; and page 124, line 15 through 25. Where points of  
24 order are waived against part of a paragraph or section,  
25 points of order against a provision in another part of such

1 paragraph or section may be made only against such pro-  
2 vision and not against the entire paragraph or section.  
3 During consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chair-  
4 man of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority  
5 in recognition on the basis of whether the Member offering  
6 an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion  
7 of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose  
8 in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall  
9 be considered as read. When the committee rises and re-  
10 ports the bill back to the House with a recommendation  
11 that the bill do pass, the previous question shall be consid-  
12 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to  
13 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-  
14 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
