1 SECTION 1. TRAFFICKING DEFINED.

2	(a) Counterfeit Goods or Services.—Section
3	2320(e) of title 18, United States Code, is amended—
4	(1) by striking paragraph (2) and inserting the
5	following:
6	"(2) the term 'traffic' means to transport,
7	transfer, or otherwise dispose of, to another, for pur-
8	poses of commercial advantage or private financial
9	gain, or to make, import, export, obtain control of,
10	or possess, with intent to so transport, transfer, or
11	otherwise dispose of;"; and
12	(2) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-
13	graph (4) and inserting the following:
14	"(3) the term 'financial gain' includes the re-
15	ceipt, or expected receipt, of anything of value;
16	and".
17	(b) Conforming Amendments.—
18	(1) Sound recordings and music videos of

20	of title 18, United States Code, is amended by strik-
