## A BILL

To extend temporarily the duty suspension on certain semi-manufactured forms of gold.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. CERTAIN SEMI-MANUFACTURED FORMS OF**  
4       **GOLD.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.71.08 of the Har-  
6       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended  
7       by striking “12/31/2003” and inserting “12/31/2010”.

8       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

9               (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by  
10       subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or with-

1 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after  
2 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this  
3 Act.

4 (2) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.—Notwith-  
5 standing section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or  
6 any other provision of law, upon proper request filed  
7 with U.S. Customs and Border Protection before the  
8 180th day after the date of enactment of this Act,  
9 the entry of any article—

10 (A) that was made on or after January 1,  
11 2004, and before the 15th day after the date of  
12 the enactment of this Act, and

13 (B) with respect to which there would have  
14 been no duty if the amendment made by sub-  
15 section (a) were in effect on the date of such  
16 entry,

17 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if such amend-  
18 ment applied to such entry, and any amounts owed  
19 shall be paid to the importer of record.
