A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to modernize payments for ambulatory surgical centers under the medicare program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ambulatory Surgical
5 Center Medicare Payment Modernization Act of 2005”.

6 **SEC. 2. MEDICARE PAYMENT FOR AMBULATORY SURGICAL**
7 **CENTER SERVICES.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1833(i) of the Social Se-
9 curity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395l(i)) is amended to read as fol-
10 lows:

1 “(i)(1) Payment shall be made under this part in the
2 amount specified under paragraph (2) for facility services
3 furnished to an individual in an ambulatory surgical cen-
4 ter in connection with any outpatient surgical procedure
5 covered under this part as a hospital outpatient depart-
6 ment service, except for those procedures that the Sec-
7 retary designates, in consultation with appropriate trade
8 and professional organizations (including those having di-
9 rect experience with ambulatory surgical centers) as pos-
10 ing a significant safety risk or requiring an overnight stay
11 when performed in ambulatory surgical centers. Not less
12 frequently than once every two years the Secretary shall
13 review and, may, after public comment, make appropriate
14 adjustments to this list of procedures excluded from cov-
15 erage when performed in ambulatory surgical centers as
16 the Secretary deems necessary.

17 “(2)(A) Subject to subparagraphs (B) and (C), the
18 amount of payment to be made under this subsection for
19 facility services furnished to an individual in an ambula-
20 tory surgical center in accordance with paragraph (1) shall
21 be equal to 75 percent of the fee schedule amount deter-
22 mined under paragraph (3)(A) of subsection (t) for pay-
23 ment of the same service furnished in hospital outpatient
24 departments, as adjusted under paragraphs (4)(A), (6),

1 and (15) of such subsection, less a 20 percent beneficiary
2 copayment.

3 “(B) For covered ambulatory surgical center services
4 furnished on or after January 1, 2008, and before Janu-
5 ary 1, 2012, for which the ambulatory surgical center pay-
6 ment amount payable under this subsection in 2007 (in
7 this subsection referred to as the ‘2007 ASC payment
8 amount’) is less than 75 percent of the hospital OPD fee
9 schedule amount under subsection (t) in 2007 for the
10 same services, the amount of payment under this sub-
11 section shall be calculated as follows:

12 “(i) For services furnished during 2008, the
13 amount shall be equal to the sum of—

14 “(I) 80 percent of the 2007 ASC payment
15 amount, as increased by the percentage increase
16 in the consumer price index for all urban con-
17 sumers (United States city average) as esti-
18 mated by the Secretary for the 12-month period
19 ending with December 31, 2006; and

20 “(II) 20 percent of the payment amount
21 under paragraph (2)(A) for 2008.

22 “(ii) For services furnished during 2009, the
23 amount shall be equal to the sum of—

24 “(I) 60 percent of the 2007 ASC payment
25 amount as increased under clause (i)(I) and as

1 further increased by the percentage increase in
2 the consumer price index for all urban con-
3 sumers (United States city average) as esti-
4 mated by the Secretary for the 12-month period
5 ending with December 31, 2007; and

6 “(II) 40 percent of the payment amount
7 under paragraph (2)(A) for 2009.

8 “(iii) For services furnished during 2010, the
9 amount shall be equal to the sum of—

10 “(I) 40 percent of the 2007 ASC payment
11 amount as increased under clauses (i)(I) and
12 (ii)(I) and as further increased by the percent-
13 age increase in the consumer price index for all
14 urban consumers (United States city average)
15 as estimated by the Secretary for the 12-month
16 period ending with December 31, 2008; and

17 “(II) 60 percent of the payment amount
18 under paragraph (2)(A) for 2010.

19 “(iv) For services furnished during 2011, the
20 amount shall be equal to the sum of—

21 “(I) 20 percent of the 2007 ASC payment
22 amount as increased under clauses (i)(I), (ii)(I),
23 and (iii)(I) and as further increased by the per-
24 centage increase in the consumer price index for
25 all urban consumers (United States city aver-

1 age) as estimated by the Secretary for the 12-
2 month period ending with December 31, 2009;
3 and

4 “(II) 80 percent of the payment amount
5 under paragraph (2)(A) for 2011.

6 “(C) For covered ambulatory surgical center services
7 for which the 2007 ASC payment amount is—

8 “(i) greater than 75 percent, but less than 100
9 percent, of the hospital OPD fee schedule amount
10 under subsection (t) in 2007 for the same services,
11 the amount of payment under this subsection shall
12 be the greater of the 2007 ASC payment amount
13 or—

14 “(I) for services furnished in 2008, the
15 payment amount under subparagraph (B)(i);

16 “(II) for services furnished in 2009, the
17 payment amount under subparagraph (B)(ii);

18 “(III) for services furnished in 2010, the
19 payment amount under subparagraph (B)(iii);

20 “(IV) for services furnished in 2011, the
21 payment amount under subparagraph (B)(iv);

22 or

23 “(V) in 2012 and subsequent years, the
24 payment amount under subparagraph (A),

1 but in no case in excess of the then applicable hos-
2 pital OPD fee schedule amount; or

3 “(ii) greater than the hospital OPD fee sched-
4 ule amount under subsection (t) in 2007 for the
5 same services, the amount of payment under this
6 subsection—

7 “(I) for services furnished during 2008, is
8 equal to the midpoint between the 2007 ASC
9 payment amount and 100 percent of such 2007
10 hospital OPD fee schedule amount; or

11 “(II) for services furnished in a subsequent
12 year is equal to the greater of the 2007 hospital
13 OPD fee schedule amount or the payment
14 amount specified under subclause (I) through
15 (V) of clause (i) for the year involved, but in no
16 case in excess of the then applicable hospital
17 OPD fee schedule amount.”.

18 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

19 (1) Section 1832(a)(2)(F)(i) of such Act (42
20 U.S.C. 1395k(a)(2)(F)(i)) is amended—

21 (A) by striking “section 1833(i)(1)(A)”
22 and inserting “section 1833(i)(1)”;

23 (B) by striking “the standard overhead
24 amount as determined under section

1 1833(i)(2)(A)” and inserting “the amount de-
2 termined under section 1833(i)(2)”;

3 (C) by striking all that follows “as full
4 payment for such services” and inserting “,
5 or”.

6 (2) Section 1833(a)(1)(G) of such Act (42
7 U.S.C. 1395l(a)(1)(G)) is amended—

8 (A) by striking “subsection (i)(1)(A)” and
9 inserting “subsection (i)(1)”;

10 (B) by striking “for services furnished be-
11 ginning” and all that follows through “sub-
12 section (i)(2)(D)”;

13 (C) by striking “such revised payment sys-
14 tem” and inserting “under subsection (i)(2)”.

15 (3) Section 1833(a)(4) of such Act (42 U.S.C.
16 1395l(a)(4)) is amended—

17 (A) by striking “section 1833(i)(1)(A)”
18 and inserting “subsection (i)(1)”;

19 (B) by striking “paragraph (2) or (3) of
20 subsection (i)” and inserting “subsection
21 (i)(1)”.

22 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
23 this section shall apply to ambulatory surgical center serv-
24 ices furnished on or after January 1, 2008.

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
