A BILL

To establish the Comprehensive Entitlement Reform Commission.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** 4 This Act may be cited as the "Comprehensive Entitlement Reform Commission Act of 2005". SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS. 6 7 In this Act:
- COMMISSION.—The term "Commission" 8

- 12 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.
- There is established a commission to be known as the
- 14 "Comprehensive Entitlement Reform Commission".
- 15 SEC. 4. PURPOSE.
- 16 The Commission will review Social Security, Medi-
- 17 care, and Medicaid and make comprehensive recommenda-
- 18 tions to sustain the solvency and stability of these three
- 19 programs for future generations.
- 20 SEC. 5. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.
- 21 (a) In General.—The Commission shall conduct a
- 22 comprehensive review of Social Security, Medicare, and
- 23 Medicaid consistent with the purpose specified in section
- 24 4 and shall submit the report required under subsection
- 25 (b).

- 1 (b) PROHIBITED APPOINTMENTS.—Members of the
- 2 Commission shall not include Members of Congress or
- 3 other elected Federal, State, or local government officials.
- 4 (c) Period of Appointment.—Each member shall
- 5 be appointed for the life of the Commission. Any vacancies
- 6 shall not affect the power and duties of the Commission
- 7 but shall be filled in the same manner as the original ap-

- 9 (d) Date.—Members of the Commission shall be ap-

- 22 SEC. 7. ADMINISTRATION.
- (a) Quorum.—Five members of the Commission
- 24 shall constitute a quorum for purposes of voting, but a

4	(1) In general.—The Commission shall meet
5	at the call of the Co-Chairpersons or a majority of
6	its members.
7	(2) Open meetings.—Each meeting of the
8	Commission, other than meetings in which classified
9	information is to be discussed, shall be open to the
10	public.
11	(c) Hearings.—The Commission may hold such
12	hearings and undertake such other activities as the Com-
13	mission determines to be necessary to carry out its duties.
14	(d) Travel Expenses.—Members shall receive trav-
15	el expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in
16	accordance with sections 5702 and 5703 of title 5, United
17	States Code, while away from their homes or regular
18	places of business in performance of services for the Com-
19	mission.
20	(e) Staff.—
21	(1) Executive director.—The Commission
22	shall have a staff headed by an Executive Director.
23	The Executive Director shall be paid at a rate equiv-
24	alent to a rate established for the Senior Executive

- 1 Service under section 5382 of title 5, United States 2 Code.
- 3 (2) STAFF APPOINTMENT.—With the approval 4 of the Commission, the Executive Director may ap-5 point such personnel as the Executive Director de-6 termines to be appropriate.
 - (3) ACTUARIAL EXPERTS AND CONSULTANTS.—
 With the approval of the Commission, the Executive
 Director may procure temporary and intermittent
 services under section 3109(b) of title 5, United
 States Code.
 - (4) DETAIL OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.—
 Upon the request of the Commission, the head of any Federal agency may detail, without reimbursement, any of the personnel of such agency to the Commission to assist in carrying out the duties of the Commission. Any such detail shall not interrupt or otherwise affect the civil service status or privileges of the Federal employee.
 - (5) OTHER RESOURCES.—The Commission shall have reasonable access to materials, resources, statistical data, and other information such Commission determines to be necessary to carry out its duties from the Library of Congress, the Chief Actuary of Social Security, the Congressional Budget Office,

- 1 and other agencies and elected representatives of the
- 2 executive and legislative branches of the Federal
- 3 Government. The Co-Chairpersons of the Commis-
- 4 sion shall make requests for such access in writing
- 5 when necessary.

6 SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 7 (a) In General.—There are authorized to be appro-
- 8 priated for fiscal year 2006, \$1,500,000 to carry out the
- 9 purposes of this Act.
- 10 (b) AVAILABILITY.—Any sums appropriated under
- 11 the subsection (a) shall remain available, without fiscal
- 12 year limitation, until expended.
