Mr. DURBIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To strengthen civil-military relationships by permitting State and local governments to enter into lease purchase agreements with the United States Armed Forces.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as “The Military Installation
5 and Community Lease-Purchase Expansion Act of 2005”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANDED AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO LEASE-**
7 **PURCHASE AGREEMENTS.**

8 Section 2812 of title 10, United States Code, is
9 amended—

1 (1) in subsection (a)(1)—

2 (A) by striking “a private contractor” and
3 inserting “an eligible entity”; and

4 (B) by striking “the contractor” and in-
5 serting “the eligible entity”;

6 (2) in subsection (c)—

7 (A) by striking “(c)(1)” and inserting
8 “(c)”;

9 (B) by striking paragraph (2); and

10 (C) by redesignating subparagraphs (A)
11 and (B) as paragraphs (1) and (2); and

12 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
13 section:

14 “(e) In this section, the term ‘eligible entity’ means
15 any private person, corporation, firm, partnership, com-
16 pany, or State or local government.”.
