- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. INCLUSION OF EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DE-
- 4 FENSE PROPERTY ON SANTA ROSA AND
- 5 OKALOOSA ISLAND IN GULF ISLANDS NA-
- 6 TIONAL SEASHORE.
- 7 Section 7 of Public Law 91–660 (16 U.S.C. 459h–
- 8 6) is amended—

1	(1) by inserting "(a)" before "There are"; and
2	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
3	section:
4	"(b) If any of the Federal land on Santa Rosa or
5	Okaloosa Island, Florida, under the jurisdiction of the De-
6	partment of Defense is ever excess to the needs of the
7	Armed Forces, the Secretary of Defense shall transfer,
8	without reimbursement, the excess land to the administra-
9	tive jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior. The Sec-
10	retary of the Interior shall administer the transferred land
11	as part of the seashore in accordance with the provisions
12	of this Act.".
