## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study to evaluate the significance of the Colonel James Barrett Farm in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and assess the suitability and feasibility of including the farm in the National Park System as part of the Minute Man National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Colonel James Barrett
- 5 Farm Study Act of 2005".

### 1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS. 2 In this Act: 3 (1) Barrett's farm.—The term "Barrett's 4 Farm" means the Colonel James Barrett Farm list-5 ed on the National Register of Historic Places, in-6 cluding the house and buildings on the approxi-7 mately 6 acres of land in Concord, Massachusetts. 8 Park.—The term "Park" means the Minute Man National Historical Park. 9 (3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means 10 11 the Secretary of the Interior. 12 SEC. 3. STUDY. 13 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the date on which funds are made available to carry out this 15 section, the Secretary shall conduct a boundary study to— 16 (1) evaluate the significance of Barrett's Farm; 17 and 18 (2) assess the suitability and feasibility of in-19 cluding Barrett's Farm in the National Park System 20 as part of the Park. 21 (b) Contents.—The study conducted under sub-22 section (a) shall include— 23 (1) an analysis of— 24 (A) the significance of Barrett's Farm with

respect to the Revolutionary War;

1	(B) opportunities for public enjoyment of
2	Barrett's Farm as part of the Park; and
3	(C) any operational, management, and pri-
4	vate property issues that need to be considered
5	if Barrett's Farm is added to the Park;
6	(2) a determination by the Secretary of the fea-
7	sibility of administering Barrett's Farm as part of
8	the Park, taking into account the size, configuration,
9	and costs of the expanded Park and any other fac-
10	tors that the Secretary determines to be appropriate;
11	and
12	(3) an evaluation of the adequacy of other alter-
13	natives for management and resource protection of
14	Barrett's Farm.
15	SEC. 4. REPORT.
16	On completion of the study under section 3, the Sec-
17	retary shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Nat-
18	ural Resources of the Senate and the Committee on Re-
19	sources of the House of Representatives a report on the
20	findings of the study.
