Mr. Talent introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study to determine the suitability and feasibility of designating the Soldiers' Memorial Military Museum located in St. Louis, Missouri, as a unit of the National Park System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE STUDY REGARDING

- 6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

(1) the Soldiers' Memorial is a tribute to all
veterans located in the greater St. Louis area, in-
cluding Southern Illinois;
(2) the current annual budget for the memoria
is \$185,000 and is paid for exclusively by the City
of St. Louis;
(3) in 1923, the City of St. Louis voted to
spend \$6,000,000 to purchase a memorial plaza and
building dedicated to citizens of St. Louis who lost
their lives in World War I;
(4) the purchase of the 7-block site exhausted
the funds and no money remained to construct a
monument;
(5) in 1933, Mayor Bernard F. Dickmann ap-
pealed to citizens and the city government to raise
\$1,000,000 to construct a memorial building and
general improvement of the plaza area, and the con-
struction of Soldiers' Memorial began on October
21, 1935;
(6) on October 14, 1936, President Franklin D
Roosevelt officially dedicated the site; and
(7) on Memorial Day in 1938, Mayor
Dickmann opened the building to the public.
(b) Study.—The Secretary of the Interior shall carry

- 4 (c) STUDY PROCESS AND COMPLETION.—Section

- 6 apply to the conduct and completion of the study under
- 7 this section.
- 8 (d) Report.—The Secretary shall submit to the
- 9 Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen-
- 10 ate and the Committee on Resources of the House of Rep-
- 11 resentatives a report describing the results the study
- 12 under this section.
