To assist pharmacies in facilitating enrollment of dual eligible populations under the Medicare prescription drug benefit.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medicare Dual Eligible
- 5 Identification and Enrollment Facilitation Act of 2005".

1	SEC. 2. FACILITATION OF IDENTIFICATION AND ENROLL-
2	MENT THROUGH PHARMACIES OF FULL-BEN-
3	EFIT DUAL ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS IN THE
4	MEDICARE PART D DRUG PROGRAM.
5	(a) In General.—The Secretary of Health and
6	Human Services shall provide for outreach and education
7	to pharmacies participating under part D of title XVIII
8	of the Social Security Act, particularly independent phar-
9	macies, on the following:
10	(1) The full-benefit dual eligible population.
11	(2) The transition from Medicaid prescription
12	drug coverage to coverage under such part for such
13	population.
14	(3) The processes established by the Secretary
15	to facilitate, at point of sale, identification of drug
16	plan assignment of such population or enrollment of
17	previously unidentified or new full-benefit dual eligi-
18	ble individuals into Medicare part D prescription
19	drug coverage, including how pharmacies can use
20	such processes to help ensure that such population
21	makes a successful transition to Medicare part D
22	without a lapse in prescription drug coverage.
23	(b) Holding Pharmacies Harmless for Certain
24	Costs.—The Secretary of Health and Human Services
25	shall provide for such payments to pharmacies as may be
26	necessary to reimburse pharmacies fully for—

1	(1) any transaction fees associated with the
2	point-of-sale facilitated identification and enrollment
3	processes referred to in subsection (a)(3); and
4	(2) costs associated with any technology or soft-

(2) costs associated with any technology or software upgrade necessary to make any identification and enrollment inquiries as part of such processes.

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
