Mr. Lautenberg (for himself and Mr. Menendez) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To provide for disclosure of fire safety standards and measures with respect to campus buildings, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Campus Fire Safety
- 5 Right-to-Know Act of 2006".
- 6 SEC. 2. DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY OF CAMPUS BUILD-
- 7 INGS.
- 8 Section 485 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
- 9 U.S.C. 1092) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)$ —
2	(A) by striking "and" at the end of sub-
3	paragraph (N);
4	(B) by striking the period at the end of
5	subparagraph (O) and inserting "; and; and
6	(C) by adding at the end the following new
7	subparagraph:
8	"(P) the fire safety report prepared by the in-
9	stitution pursuant to subsection (h)."; and
10	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
11	section:
12	"(h) DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY STANDARDS AND
13	Measures.—
14	"(1) Annual fire safety reports re-
15	QUIRED.—Each institution participating in any pro-
16	gram under this title shall, beginning in the first
17	academic year that begins after the date of enact-
18	ment of the Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know Act
19	of 2006, and each year thereafter, prepare, publish,
20	and distribute, through appropriate publications (in-
21	cluding the Internet) or mailings, to all current stu-
22	dents and employees, and to any applicant for en-
23	rollment or employment upon request, an annual fire
24	safety report. Such reports shall contain at least the

1	following information with respect to the campus fire
2	safety practices and standards of that institution:
3	"(A) A statement that identifies each insti-
4	tution owned or controlled student housing fa-
5	cility, and whether or not such facility is
6	equipped with a fire sprinkler system or other
7	fire safety system, or has fire escape planning
8	or protocols.
9	"(B) Statistics for each such facility con-
10	cerning the occurrence of fires and false alarms
11	in such facility, during the 2 preceding calendar
12	years for which data are available.
13	"(C) For each such occurrence in each
14	such facility, a summary of the human injuries
15	or deaths, structural or property damage, or
16	combination thereof.
17	"(D) Information regarding rules on port-
18	able electrical appliances, smoking and open
19	flames (such as candles), regular mandatory su-
20	pervised fire drills, and planned and future im-
21	provements in fire safety.
22	"(E) Information about fire safety edu-
23	cation and training provided to students, fac-
24	ulty, and staff.

1	"(F) Information concerning fire safety at
2	any housing facility owned or controlled by a
3	fraternity, sorority, or student group that is
4	recognized by the institution, including—
5	"(i) information reported to the insti-
6	tution under paragraph (4); and
7	"(ii) a statement concerning whether
8	and how the institution works with recog-
9	nized student fraternities and sororities,
10	and other recognized student groups own-
11	ing or controlling housing facilities, to
12	make building and property owned or con-
13	trolled by such fraternities, sororities, and
14	groups more fire safe.
15	"(2) Fraternities, sororities, and other
16	GROUPS.—Each institution participating in a pro-
17	gram under this title shall request each fraternity
18	and sorority that is recognized by the institution,
19	and any other student group that is recognized by
20	the institution and that owns or controls housing fa-
21	cilities, to collect and report to the institution the in-
22	formation described in subparagraphs (A) through
23	(E) of paragraph (1), as applied to the fraternity,

sorority, or recognized student group, respectively,

for each building and property owned or controlled by the fraternity, sorority, or group, respectively.

> "(3) Current information to campus com-Munity.—Each institution participating in any program under this title shall make, keep, and maintain a log, written in a form that can be easily understood, recording all on-campus fires, including the nature, date, time, and general location of each fire and all false fire alarms. All entries that are required pursuant to this paragraph shall, except where disclosure of such information is prohibited by law, be open to public inspection, and each such institution shall make annual reports to the campus community on such fires and false fire alarms in a manner that will aid the prevention of similar occurrences.

> "(4) Reports to the Secretary.—On an annual basis, each institution participating in any program under this title shall submit to the Secretary a copy of the statistics required to be made available under paragraph (1)(B). The Secretary shall—

"(A) review such statistics;

"(B) make copies of the statistics submitted to the Secretary available to the public; and

"(C) in coordination with nationally recog-1 2 nized fire organizations and representatives of 3 institutions of higher education, identify exem-4 plary fire safety policies, procedures, and prac-5 tices and disseminate information concerning 6 those policies, procedures, and practices that 7 have proven effective in the reduction of cam-8 pus fires.

- "(5) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to authorize the Secretary to require particular policies, procedures, or practices by institutions of higher education with respect to fire safety.
- 14 "(6) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection, the 15 term 'campus' has the meaning provided in sub-16 section (f)(6).".

17 SEC. 3. REPORT TO CONGRESS BY THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION.

19 (a) DEFINITION OF FACILITY.—In this section the 20 term "facility" means a student housing facility owned or 21 controlled by an institution of higher education, or a hous-22 ing facility owned or controlled by a fraternity, sorority, 23 or student group that is recognized by the institution.

1	(b) Report.—Within two years after the date of en
2	actment of this Act, the Secretary of Education shall pre-
3	pare and submit to the Congress a report containing—

- (1) an analysis of the current status of fire safety systems in facilities of institutions participating in programs under title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.), including sprinkler systems;
- (2) an analysis of the appropriate fire safety standards to apply to such facilities, which the Secretary shall prepare after consultation with such fire safety experts, representatives of institutions of higher education, and other Federal agencies as the Secretary, in the Secretary's discretion, considers appropriate;
- (3) an estimate of the cost of bringing all nonconforming such facilities up to current building codes; and
- (4) recommendations from the Secretary concerning the best means of meeting fire safety standards in all such facilities, including recommendations for methods to fund such cost.
