A BILL

To authorize the National Mall Liberty Fund D.C. to establish a memorial on Federal land in the District of Columbia to honor slaves and other persons that fought for independence, liberty, and justice for all during the American Revolution.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Liberty Me-
- 5 morial Act".

1 SEC. 2. NATIONAL LIBERTY MEMORIAL.

| 19 | ferred to in subsection (a) is the portion of Constitution |
| 20 | Gardens, located on the south side of Constitution Lake |
| 21 | and west of the island, that was selected as the site for |
| 22 | the memorial authorized under section 1 of Public Law |
| 23 | 99–558 (40 U.S.C. 1003 note; 100 Stat. 3144). |

- 1 (c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The Memorial shall be estab-
