A BILL

To designate a portion of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge as wilderness.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF PORTION OF ARCTIC NA-**
4 **TIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE AS WILDERNESS.**

5 Section 4 of the National Wildlife Refuge System Ad-
6 ministration Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 668dd) is amended
7 by adding at the end the following:

1 “(p) DESIGNATION OF CERTAIN LAND AS WILDER-
2 NESS.—Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act,
3 a portion of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge in Alaska
4 comprising approximately 1,559,538 acres, as generally
5 depicted on a map entitled ‘Arctic National Wildlife Ref-
6 uge—1002 Area. Alternative E—Wilderness Designation,
7 October 28, 1991’ and available for inspection in the of-
8 fices of the Secretary, is designated as a component of
9 the National Wilderness Preservation System under the
10 Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.).”.
