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## A BILL

To reduce temporarily the duty on certain footwear not  
covering the ankle with coated or laminated textile fabrics.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. CERTAIN FOOTWEAR NOT COVERING THE**  
4               **ANKLE WITH COATED OR LAMINATED TEX-**  
5               **TILE FABRICS.**

6       (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
7       the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
8       amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
9       new heading:

“	9902.64.10	Men's footwear, not covering the ankle, valued over \$20/ pair designed to be worn over, or in lieu of, other footwear as a protection against water, oil, grease or chemicals or cold or inclement weather where such protection includes protection against water that is imparted by the use of a coated or laminated textile fabric (except footwear with waterproof injection molded bottoms, i.e. comprising a complete outer sole and all or part of the upper) (provided in subheading 6404.19.20) ..	20%	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2009	”.
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1           (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from  
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
