A BILL

To extend temporarily the suspension of duty on combed
cashmere.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION AND MODIFICATION RELATING TO**
4 **COMBED CASHMERE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.03.01 of the Har-
6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
7 yarn of combed Kashmir (cashmere) or yarn of camel
8 hair) is amended by striking the date in the effective pe-
9 riod column and inserting “12/31/2009”.

1 (b) OTHER MODIFICATIONS.—Heading 9902.03.02
2 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States
3 is amended—

4 (1) by striking “of 6 run or finer (equivalent to
5 19.35 metric yarn system)” and inserting “of 19.35
6 metric yarn count or finer”; and

7 (2) by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting
8 “12/31/2009”.

9 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
10 subsection (a) apply to goods entered, or withdrawn from
11 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
12 the date of enactment of this Act.
