A BILL

To strengthen the consequences of the fraudulent use of United States or foreign passports and other immigration documents.

- 3 SECTION 1. FRAUDULENT USE OF PASSPORTS.
- 4 (a) Criminal Code.—
- 5 (1) Secretary of Homeland Security.—
- 6 Section 1546 of title 18, United States Code, is
- 7 amended by striking "the Commissioner of the Im-
- 8 migration and Naturalization Service" each place it
- 9 appears and inserting "the Secretary of Homeland
- 10 Security".

1	(2) Definition of Passport.—Chapter 75 of
2	title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding
3	at the end the following:
4	"§ 1548. Definition
5	"In sections 1543 and 1544, the term 'passport'
6	means any passport issued by the United States or any
7	foreign country.".
8	(3) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-
9	tions for chapter 75 of title 18, United States Code,
10	is amended by adding at the end the following:
	"Sec. 1548. Definition.".
11	(b) Immigration and Nationality Act.—Section
12	101(a)(43)(P) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
13	U.S.C. $1101(a)(43)(P)$) is amended to read as follows:
14	"(P) except for a first offense for which an
15	alien affirmatively shows was committed solely
16	for the purpose of assisting, abetting, or aiding
17	only the alien's spouse, child, or parent to vio-
18	late a provision of this Act—
19	"(i) an offense described in section
20	1542, 1543, or 1544 of title 18, United
21	States Code (relating to false statements in
22	the application, forgery, or misuse of a
23	passport);
24	"(ii) an offense described in section
25	1546(a) of title 18, United States Code,

1	relating to document fraud used as evi-
2	dence of authorized stay or employment in
3	the United States for which the term of
4	imprisonment is at least 12 months; or
5	"(iii) any other offense described in
6	section 1546(a) of title 18, United States
7	Code, relating to entry into the United
8	States, regardless of the term of imprison-
9	ment imposed.".
10	SEC. 2. RELEASE AND DETENTION PRIOR TO DISPOSITION.
11	Section 3142(f)(1) of title 18, United States Code,
12	is amended—
13	(1) in subparagraph (C), by striking "or" after
14	the semicolon; and
15	(2) by adding at the end the following:
16	"(E) an offense under section 1542, 1543,
17	1544, or 1546(a) of this title; or".
