## A BILL

To adjust the boundaries of Green Mountain National  
Forest.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Green Mountain Na-  
5 tional Forest Adjustment Act of 2005”.

6 **SEC. 2. GREEN MOUNTAIN NATIONAL FOREST ADJUST-**  
7 **MENT.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The boundaries of the Green  
9 Mountain National Forest are modified to include all par-  
10 cels of land depicted on the forest maps entitled “Green  
11 Mountain Expansion Area Map I” and “Green Mountain

1 Expansion Area Map II”, each dated February 20, 2002,  
2 which shall be on file and available for public inspection  
3 in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service, Wash-  
4 ington, District of Columbia.

5 (b) MANAGEMENT.—Federally owned land delineated  
6 on the maps acquired for National Forest purposes shall  
7 continue to be managed in accordance with the laws (in-  
8 cluding regulations) applicable to the National Forest Sys-  
9 tem.

10 (c) LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND.—For  
11 the purposes of section 7 of the Land and Water Con-  
12 servation Fund Act of 1965 (16 U.S.C. 460 *l*–9), the  
13 boundaries of the Green Mountain National Forest, as ad-  
14 justed by this Act, shall be considered to be the boundaries  
15 of the national forest as of January 1, 1965.
