## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for corrections to the enrollment of the bill S.  
2590.

1       *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*  
2       *concurring)*, That, in the enrollment of the bill S. 2590,  
3       the Secretary of the Senate shall make the following cor-  
4       rections:

5               (1) In section 2(a), strike paragraphs (2) and  
6       (3) and insert the following:

7               “(2) FEDERAL AWARD.—The term ‘Federal  
8       award’—

9               “(A) means Federal financial assistance  
10       and expenditures that—

1 “(i) include grants, subgrants, loans,  
2 awards, cooperative agreements, and other  
3 forms of financial assistance;

4 “(ii) include contracts, subcontracts,  
5 purchase orders, task orders, and delivery  
6 orders;

7 “(B) does not include individual trans-  
8 actions below \$25,000; and

9 “(C) before October 1, 2008, does not in-  
10 clude credit card transactions.

11 “(3) SEARCHABLE WEBSITE.—The term  
12 ‘searchable website’ means a website that allows the  
13 public to—

14 “(A) search and aggregate Federal funding  
15 by any element required by subsection (b)(1);

16 “(B) ascertain through a single search the  
17 total amount of Federal funding awarded to an  
18 entity by a Federal award described in para-  
19 graph (2)(A)(i), by fiscal year;

20 “(C) ascertain through a single search the  
21 total amount of Federal funding awarded to an  
22 entity by a Federal award described in para-  
23 graph (2)(A)(ii), by fiscal year; and

1 “(D) download data included in subpara-  
2 graph (A) included in the outcome from  
3 searches.”.

4 (2) In section 2(b)(1), strike “section and sec-  
5 tion 204 of the E-Government Act of 2002 (Public  
6 Law 107–347; 44 U.S.C. 3501 note),” and insert  
7 “section, section 204 of the E-Government Act of  
8 2002 (Public Law 107–347; 44 U.S.C. 3501 note),  
9 and the Office of Federal Procurement Policy Act  
10 (41 U.S.C. 403 et seq.),”.

11 (3) In section 2, strike subsection (c) and insert  
12 the following:

13 “(c) WEBSITE.—The website established under this  
14 section—

15 “(1) may use as the source of its data the Fed-  
16 eral Procurement Data System, Federal Assistance  
17 Award Data System, and Grants.gov, if all of these  
18 data sources are searchable through the website and  
19 can be accessed in a search on the website required  
20 by this Act, provided that the user may—

21 “(A) specify such search shall be confined  
22 to Federal contracts and subcontracts;

23 “(B) specify such search shall be confined  
24 to include grants, subgrants, loans, awards, co-

1           operative agreements, and other forms of finan-  
2           cial assistance;

3           “(2) shall not be considered in compliance if it  
4           hyperlinks to the Federal Procurement Data System  
5           website, Federal Assistance Award Data System  
6           website, Grants.gov website, or other existing  
7           websites, so that the information elements required  
8           by subsection (b)(1) cannot be searched electroni-  
9           cally by field in a single search;

10          “(3) shall provide an opportunity for the public  
11          to provide input about the utility of the site and rec-  
12          ommendations for improvements;

13          “(4) shall be updated not later than 30 days  
14          after the award of any Federal award requiring a  
15          posting; and

16          “(5) shall provide for separate searches for  
17          Federal awards described in subsection (a) to distin-  
18          guish between the Federal awards described in sub-  
19          section (a)(2)(A)(i) and those described in sub-  
20          section (a)(2)(A)(ii).”.

21          (4) Add at the end the following:

1 **“SEC. 4. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE REPORT-**  
2 **ING REQUIREMENT.**

3 “Not later than January 1, 2010, the Comptroller  
4 General shall submit to Congress a report on compliance  
5 with this Act.”.
