Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed Services.

Mr. WARNER, from the Committee on Armed Services, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

---

## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed  
Services.

1       *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and  
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-  
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such  
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,  
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1  
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,  
7 the Committee on Armed Services is authorized from  
8 March 1, 2005, through September 30, 2005; October 1,  
9 2005, through September 30, 2006; and October 1, 2006,  
10 through February 28, 2007, in its discretion (1) to make

1 expenditures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2)  
2 to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the  
3 Government department or agency concerned and the  
4 Committee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reim-  
5 bursable or nonreimbursable basis the services of per-  
6 sonnel of any such department or agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the  
8 period March 1, 2005, through September 30, 2005,  
9 under this resolution shall not exceed \$3,859,485, within  
10 which amount—

11 (1) not to exceed \$80,000 may be expended for  
12 the procurement of the services of individual consult-  
13 ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by sec-  
14 tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of  
15 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))); and

16 (2) not to exceed \$30,000 may be expended for  
17 the training of the professional staff of such com-  
18 mittee (under the procedures specified in section  
19 202(j) of that Act).

20 (b) For the period October 1, 2005, through Sep-  
21 tember 30, 2006, expenses of the committee under this  
22 resolution shall not exceed \$6,778,457, within which  
23 amount—

24 (1) not to exceed \$75,000 may be expended for  
25 the procurement of the services of individual consult-

1       ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by sec-  
2       tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of  
3       1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))); and

4               (2) not to exceed \$30,000 may be expended for  
5       the training of the professional staff of such com-  
6       mittee (under the procedures specified in section  
7       202(j) of that Act).

8       (c) For the period October 1, 2006, through Feb-  
9       ruary 28, 2007, expenses of the committee under this res-  
10      olution shall not exceed \$2,886,176, within which  
11      amount—

12              (1) not to exceed \$50,000 may be expended for  
13      the procurement of the services of individual consult-  
14      ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by sec-  
15      tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of  
16      1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))); and

17              (2) not to exceed \$30,000 may be expended for  
18      the training of the professional staff of such com-  
19      mittee (under the procedures specified in section  
20      202(j) of that Act).
