# CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress that the Government of Iraq should not grant blanket amnesty to persons known to have attacked, killed, or wounded members of the United States Armed Forces in Iraq.

Whereas United States Armed Forces and coalition military forces have served bravely in Iraq since the beginning of military operations in March 2003 and are continuing to serve heroically in Iraq to provide all the people of Iraq a better future; and

Whereas more than 3,000 members of the United States Armed Forces and coalition military forces have been killed and more than 22,500 members have been injured in operations to bring peace and stability to all the people of Iraq; Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring), That it is the sense of Congress that—*

3               (1) the Government of Iraq should not grant  
4               blanket amnesty to persons known to have attacked,  
5               killed, or wounded members of the United States  
6               Armed Forces and should not grant any amnesty to  
7               persons known to have attacked, killed, or wounded  
8               members of the United States Armed Forces subse-  
9               quent to December 15, 2005, the date on which the  
10               people of Iraq elected a permanent government of  
11               Iraq;

12               (2) the President should immediately notify the  
13               Government of Iraq that the Government of the  
14               United States strongly opposes granting blanket am-  
15               nesty to persons known to have attacked, killed, or  
16               wounded members of the United States Armed  
17               Forces; and

18               (3) the Government of Iraq should be encour-  
19               aged to inform and educate the people of Iraq about  
20               the civic-minded and selfless nature of American  
21               military personnel serving in Iraq who have built  
22               schools and hospitals, repaired roads and bridges,  
23               and risked their lives to secure a future of peace and  
24               freedom for the men, women, and children of Iraq.
