## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

1	(1) Zimbabwe is governed at the national and
2	local levels by governments that are democratically
3	elected from free and fair elections conducted under
4	the supervision of internationally recognized observ-
5	ers and in which—
6	(A) opposition parties are permitted ample
7	time to organize and campaign for such elec-
8	tions; and
9	(B) all candidates are permitted access to
10	the media;
11	(2) the Zimbabwean Government is showing re-
12	spect for the basic civil liberties and human rights
13	of the citizens of Zimbabwe;
14	(3) Zimbabwe has adopted a market-oriented
15	economic system based on the right to own and
16	enjoy property without regard to race or political af-
17	filiation;
18	(4) the Zimbabwean Government has put in
19	place a mechanism to ensure regular free and fair
20	elections;
21	(5) the Zimbabwean Government has estab-
22	lished an independent judiciary; and

1 (6) Zimbabwe's current dictator, Robert 2 Mugabe, is no longer part of the Zimbabwean Gov-

3 ernment in any capacity.
