A BILL

To establish the Commission on Economic Indicators to conduct a study and submit a report containing recommendations concerning the appropriateness and accuracy of the methodology, calculations, and reporting used by the Government relating to certain economic indicators.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Commission on Eco-
- 5 nomic Indicators Act of 2007".

1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2	Congress finds that—
3	(1) the Federal and State governments and pri-
4	vate sector entities depend on the economic statistics
5	published by the Federal Government;
6	(2) questions have been raised about the accu-
7	racy of various measures including productivity, pov-
8	erty, inflation, employment and unemployment, and
9	wages and income; and
10	(3) it is essential that these indicators accu-
11	rately reflect underlying economic activity and condi-
12	tions.
13	SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.
14	(a) Establishment.—There is established the Com-
15	mission on Economic Indicators (in this Act referred to
16	as the "Commission".
17	(b) Membership.—
18	(1) Composition.—The Commission shall be
19	composed of 8 members of whom—
20	(A) 2 shall be appointed by the majority
21	leader of the Senate, in consultation with the
22	chairmen and ranking members of the Com-
23	mittee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs
24	of the Senate, the Committee on Finance of the
25	Senate, and the Joint Economic Committee;

1	(B) 2 shall be appointed by the minority
2	leader of the Senate, in consultation with the
3	chairmen and ranking members of the Com-
4	mittee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs
5	of the Senate, the Committee on Finance of the
6	Senate, and the Joint Economic Committee;
7	(C) 2 shall be appointed by the Speaker of
8	the House of Representatives, in consultation
9	with the chairmen and ranking members of the
10	Committee on Financial Services of the House
11	of Representatives, the Committee on Ways and
12	Means of the House of Representatives, and the
13	Joint Economic Committee; and
14	(D) 2 shall be appointed by the minority
15	leader of the House of Representatives, in con-
16	sultation with the chairmen and ranking mem-
17	bers of the Committee on Financial Services of
18	the House of Representatives, the Committee
19	on Ways and Means of the House of Represent-
20	atives, and the Joint Economic Committee.
21	(2) QUALIFICATIONS.—Members of the Com-
22	mission shall be—
23	(A) appointed on a nonpartisan basis; and
24	(B) experts in the fields of economics, sta-
25	tistics, or other related professions.

- 1 (3) Date.—The appointments of the members
- 2 of the Commission shall be made not later than 60
- days after the date of enactment of this Act.
- 4 (c) Period of Appointment; Vacancies.—Mem-
- 5 bers shall be appointed for the life of the Commission. Any
- 6 vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers, but
- 7 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
- 8 ment.
- 9 (d) Initial Meeting.—Not later than 30 days after
- 10 the date on which all members of the Commission have
- 11 been appointed, the Commission shall hold its first meet-
- 12 ing.
- 13 (e) Meetings.—The Commission shall meet at the
- 14 call of the Chairman.
- 15 (f) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of the
- 16 Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser num-
- 17 ber of members may hold hearings.
- 18 (g) CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN.—The Commis-
- 19 sion shall select a Chairman and Vice Chairman from
- 20 among its members.
- 21 SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.
- 22 (a) Study.—The Commission shall conduct a study
- 23 of—
- 24 (1) economic statistics collected and reported by
- United States Government agencies, including na-

- 1 tional income, employment and unemployment,
- 2 wages, personal income, wealth, savings, debt, pro-
- ductivity, inflation, and international trade and cap-
- 4 ital flows; and
- 5 (2) ways to improve the related statistical
- 6 measurements.
- 7 (b) Consultation.—In conducting the study under
- 8 this section, the Commission shall consult with—
- 9 (1) the Chairman of the Federal Reserve Board
- of Governors;
- 11 (2) the Secretary of Commerce;
- 12 (3) the Secretary of Labor;
- 13 (4) the Secretary of the Treasury;
- 14 (5) the Chairman of the Council of Economic
- 15 Advisers; and
- 16 (6) the Comptroller General of the United
- 17 States.
- 18 (c) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date
- 19 of the first meeting of the Commission, the Commission
- 20 shall submit a report to Congress which shall contain a
- 21 detailed statement of the findings and conclusions of the
- 22 Commission, together with recommendations for such leg-
- 23 islation and administrative actions as the Commission con-
- 24 siders appropriate, including a recommendation of the ap-

- 1 propriateness of establishing a similar commission after
- 2 the termination of the Commission.

3 SEC. 5. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.

- 4 (a) Hearings.—The Commission may hold such
- 5 hearings, sit and act at such times and places, take such
- 6 testimony, and receive such evidence as the Commission
- 7 considers advisable to carry out this Act.
- 8 (b) Information From Federal Agencies.—The
- 9 Commission may secure directly from any Federal depart-
- 10 ment or agency such information as the Commission con-
- 11 siders necessary to carry out this Act. Upon request of
- 12 the Chairman of the Commission, the head of such depart-
- 13 ment or agency shall furnish such information to the Com-
- 14 mission. The Commission shall maintain the same level of
- 15 confidentiality for such information made available under
- 16 this subsection as is required of the head of the depart-
- 17 ment or agency from which the information was obtained.
- 18 (c) Postal Services.—The Commission may use
- 19 the United States mails in the same manner and under
- 20 the same conditions as other departments and agencies of
- 21 the Federal Government.

22 SEC. 6. COMMISSION PERSONNEL MATTERS.

- (a) Compensation of Members.—Each member of
- 24 the Commission who is not an officer or employee of the
- 25 Federal Government shall be compensated at a rate equal

- 1 to the daily equivalent of the maximum annual rate of
- 2 basic pay for grade GS-15 of the General Schedule under
- 3 section 5332 of title 5, United States Code, for each day
- 4 (including travel time) during which such member is en-
- 5 gaged in the performance of the duties of the Commission.
- 6 All members of the Commission who are officers or em-
- 7 ployees of the United States shall serve without compensa-
- 8 tion in addition to that received for their services as offi-
- 9 cers or employees of the United States.
- 10 (b) Travel Expenses.—The members of the Com-
- 11 mission shall be allowed travel expenses, including per
- 12 diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for employ-
- 13 ees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title
- 14 5, United States Code, while away from their homes or
- 15 regular places of business in the performance of services
- 16 for the Commission.
- 17 (c) Staff.—
- 18 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Chairman of the Com-
- mission may, without regard to the civil service laws
- and regulations, appoint and terminate an executive
- 21 director and such other additional personnel as may
- be necessary to enable the Commission to perform
- 23 its duties. The employment of an executive director
- shall be subject to confirmation by the Commission.

(2) Compensation.—The Chairman of the Commission may fix the compensation of the executive director and other personnel without regard to chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code, relating to classification of positions and General Schedule pay rates, except that the rate of pay for the executive director and other personnel may not exceed the rate payable for level V of the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of such title.

(3) Personnel as federal employees.—

- (A) IN GENERAL.—The executive director and any personnel of the Commission who are employees shall be employees under section 2105 of title 5, United States Code, for purposes of chapters 63, 81, 83, 84, 85, 87, 89, 89A, 89B, and 90 of that title.
- (B) Members of Board.—Subparagraph
 (A) shall not be construed to apply to members
 of the Commission.
- 21 (d) Detail of Government Employees.—Any 22 Federal Government employee may be detailed to the 23 Commission without reimbursement, and such detail shall 24 be without interruption or loss of civil service status or 25 privilege.

- 1 (e) Procurement of Temporary and Intermit-
- 2 TENT SERVICES.—The Chairman of the Commission may
- 3 procure temporary and intermittent services under section
- 4 3109(b) of title 5, United States Code, at rates for individ-
- 5 uals which do not exceed the daily equivalent of the annual
- 6 rate of basic pay prescribed for level V of the Executive
- 7 Schedule under section 5316 of such title.
- 8 SEC. 7. TERMINATION OF THE COMMISSION.
- 9 The Commission shall terminate 90 days after the
- 10 date on which the Commission submits its report under
- 11 section 4.
- 12 SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 14 as necessary to carry out this Act.
