A BILL

To provide for free mailing privileges for personal correspondence and parcels sent to members of the Armed Forces serving on active duty in Iraq or Afghanistan.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supply Our Soldiers
5 Act of 2007”.

1 **SEC. 2. POSTAL BENEFITS PROGRAM FOR MEMBERS OF**
2 **THE ARMED FORCES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense, in con-
4 sultation with the United States Postal Service, shall pro-
5 vide for a program under which postal benefits shall be
6 provided to qualified individuals in accordance with suc-
7 ceeding provisions of this Act.

8 (b) QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL.—For purposes of this
9 Act, the term “qualified individual” means an individual
10 who is—

11 (1) a member of the Armed Forces of the
12 United States on active duty (as defined in section
13 101 of title 10, United States Code); and

14 (2)(A) serving in Iraq or Afghanistan; or

15 (B) hospitalized at a facility under the jurisdic-
16 tion of the Armed Forces of the United States as a
17 result of a disease or injury incurred as a result of
18 service in Iraq or Afghanistan.

19 (c) POSTAL BENEFITS DESCRIBED.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—The postal benefits provided
21 under this Act shall consist of such coupons or other
22 similar evidence of credit (whether in printed, elec-
23 tronic, or other format, and hereinafter in this Act
24 referred to as “vouchers”) as the Secretary of De-
25 fense (in consultation with the Postal Service) shall

1 determine, entitling the bearer or user to make
2 qualified mailings free of postage.

3 (2) QUALIFIED MAILING.—For purposes of this
4 Act, the term “qualified mailing” means the mailing
5 of a single mail piece which—

6 (A) is described in subparagraph (A) or
7 (B) of paragraph (3);

8 (B) is sent from within an area served by
9 a United States post office; and

10 (C) is addressed to a qualified individual.

11 (3) MAIL DESCRIBED.—Mail described in this
12 paragraph is—

13 (A) any first-class mail (including any
14 sound- or video-recorded communication) not
15 exceeding 13 ounces in weight and having the
16 character of personal correspondence; and

17 (B) parcel post not exceeding 15 pounds in
18 weight.

19 (4) LIMITATIONS.—

20 (A) NUMBER.—An individual shall be eligi-
21 ble for 1 voucher for each month in which such
22 individual is a qualified individual.

23 (B) USE.—Any such voucher may not be
24 used—

1 (i) for more than a single qualified
2 mailing; or

3 (ii) after the earlier of—

4 (I) the expiration date of such
5 voucher, as designated by the Sec-
6 retary of Defense; or

7 (II) the last day of the 1-year pe-
8 riod referred to in section 4.

9 (5) COORDINATION RULE.—Postal benefits
10 under this Act shall be in addition to, and not in lieu
11 of, any reduced rates of postage or other similar
12 benefits which might otherwise be available by or
13 under law, including any rates of postage resulting
14 from the application of section 3401(b) of title 39,
15 United States Code.

16 (d) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 30 days after the
17 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense
18 (in consultation with the Postal Service) shall prescribe
19 any regulations necessary to carry out this Act, includ-
20 ing—

21 (1) procedures by which vouchers will be pro-
22 vided or made available in timely manner to persons
23 duly identified by qualified individuals to receive
24 those vouchers; and

1 (2) procedures to ensure that the number of
2 vouchers provided or made available with respect to
3 any qualified individual complies with subsection
4 (c)(4)(A).

5 **SEC. 3. FUNDING.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be appro-
7 priated to the Department of Defense a sum determined
8 by the Department of Defense to be equal to the expenses
9 incurred by the Department in providing the benefits de-
10 scribed in section 2(c).

11 (b) TRANSFERS TO POSTAL SERVICE.—

12 (1) BASED ON ESTIMATES.—The Department
13 of Defense shall transfer to the Postal Service, out
14 of any amount so appropriated and in advance of
15 each calendar quarter during which postal benefits
16 under this Act may be used, an amount equal to the
17 amount of postal benefits that the Department of
18 Defense estimates will be used during such quarter,
19 reduced or increased (as the case may be) by any
20 amounts by which the Department finds that a de-
21 termination under this section for a prior quarter
22 was greater than or less than the amount finally de-
23 termined for such quarter.

24 (2) BASED ON FINAL DETERMINATION.—A
25 final determination of the amount necessary to cor-

1 rect any previous determination under this section,
2 and any transfer of amounts between the Postal
3 Service and the Department of Defense based on
4 that final determination, shall be made not later
5 than 6 months after the end of the 1-year period re-
6 ferred to in section 4.

7 (c) CONSULTATION REQUIRED.—All estimates and
8 determinations under this section of the amount of postal
9 benefits under this Act used in any period shall be made
10 by the Department of Defense in consultation with the
11 Postal Service.

12 **SEC. 4. DURATION.**

13 The postal benefits under this Act shall apply with
14 respect to mail matter sent during the 1-year period begin-
15 ning on the date on which the regulations under section
16 2(d) take effect.
