Mr. Holt introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

A BILL

To establish the American Veterans Congressional Internship Program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. AMERICAN VETERANS CONGRESSIONAL IN-
- 4 TERNSHIP PROGRAM.
- 5 (a) Establishment.—There is hereby established
- 6 the American Veterans Congressional Internship Pro-
- 7 gram, under which each Member of the House of Rep-
- 8 resentatives may hire, for a period not to exceed 12
- 9 months, one additional employee who meets the eligibility
- 10 criteria described in subsection (b) to serve as the Amer-
- 11 ican Veteran Congressional Intern.

(b) Criteria for Eligibility.—

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- 2 (1) IN GENERAL.—An individual is eligible to 3 serve as an American Veteran Congressional Intern 4 for the office of a Member of the House of Rep-5 resentatives if the individual meets such criteria as 6 the Committee on House Administration may estab-7 lish.
- 8 (2)Specific INFORMATION AND ASSUR-9 ANCES.—Under the criteria established under para-10 graph (1), an individual shall not be eligible to serve 11 as an Intern for the office of a Member of the House 12 of Representatives unless the individual provides the 13 following:
 - (A) A certification that the individual served in the Armed Forces of the United States or in the reserve components of the armed forces.
- 18 (B) A certification that the individual was
 19 honorably discharged from such service.
- 20 (c) Compensation.—A Member of the House of 21 Representatives shall pay the American Veteran Congres-22 sional Intern serving in the Member's office a total salary 23 of \$25,000, to be paid to the Intern at a rate of \$2,083.33 24 per month out of applicable accounts of the House of Rep-

25 resentatives.

1 SEC. 2. NO EFFECT ON NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES OR MEM-

- 2 BER'S REPRESENTATIONAL ALLOWANCE.
- 3 The employment of an American Veteran Congres-
- 4 sional Intern by a Member of the House of Representa-
- 5 tives, and the payment of a salary to such an Intern by
- 6 a Member, shall be in addition to all personnel and allow-
- 7 ances otherwise made available to Members under other
- 8 provisions of law, rule, or other authority.
- 9 SEC. 3. REGULATIONS.
- The Committee on House Administration shall pre-
- 11 scribe such regulations as may be necessary to carry out
- 12 this Act.
- 13 SEC. 4. DEFINITION.
- In this Act, the term "Member of the House of Rep-
- 15 resentatives" includes a Delegate or Resident Commis-
- 16 sioner to Congress.

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
