1	SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON FEDERAL PREEMPTION OF
2	MORE STRINGENT STATE CHEMICAL FACIL-
3	ITY SECURITY REGULATIONS.
4	Section 877 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
5	(6 U.S.C. 457) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6	lowing new subsection:
7	"(c) Chemical Facility Security Regula-
8	TIONS.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
9	Secretary may not prescribe any regulation that precludes
10	or denies any right of any State or political subdivision
11	thereof to adopt or enforce any regulation, requirement,
12	or standard of performance with respect to chemical facil-
13	ity security that is more stringent than a regulation pre-
14	scribed by the Secretary.".
