1	SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT FOR ACCESS TO FEMA DATA-
2	BASES TO COMPLY WITH SEX OFFENDER

4	Section 552a(b) of title 5, United States Code, is

6	(1) by striking "or" at the end of paragraph
7	(11);
8	(2) by striking the period at the end of para-
9	graph (12) and inserting "; or"; and
10	(3) by adding at the end the following new
11	paragraph:
12	"(13) disclosure of a record contained in a sys-
13	tem of records maintained by the Federal Emer-
14	gency Management Agency on assistance provided to
15	individuals in connection with a major disaster or
16	emergency, for purposes of disclosure to another
17	agency or to an instrumentality of any governmental
18	jurisdiction within or under the control of the

1	SEC. 2. DISCLOSURE OF RECORDS MAINTAINED BY NON-
2	GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS PRO-
3	VIDING EVACUATION ASSISTANCE.
4	Title III of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief
5	and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.)
6	is amended by adding at the end the following:
7	"SEC. 327. DISCLOSURE OF RECORDS MAINTAINED BY NON-
8	GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS PRO-
9	VIDING EVACUATION ASSISTANCE.
0	"(a) In General.—As a condition of receipt of Fed-
1	eral funds under this Act for services related to evacuating
2	individuals from an area in response to a hazard or threat
3	of a hazard, a nongovernmental organization shall provide
4	assurances satisfactory to the President that the organiza-
5	tion will disclose to a jurisdiction, upon written request,
6	records maintained by the organization in connection with
7	such services if the purpose of the disclosure is to permit
8	the jurisdiction to comply with a Federal or State sex of-
9	fender registry or notification law.
20	"(b) Liability Protection.—Notwithstanding any
21	other provision of law, no organization or any employee
22	thereof disclosing a record to a jurisdiction pursuant to
23	an assurance made under subsection (a) shall be held, by
24	reason of making the disclosure, to be liable in damages
25	under any law of the United States or of any State (or
26	political subdivision thereof) unless the information dis-

- 2 knew that the information was false.".
