A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH INTEGRATED BOR-**
2 **DER INSPECTION AREAS AT BLUE WATER**
3 **BRIDGE CONNECTING PORT HURON, MICHIGAN,**
4 **AND POINT EDWARD, ONTARIO, CAN-**
5 **ADA.**

6 Section 1560 of the Miscellaneous Trade and Tech-
7 nical Corrections Act of 2004 (Public Law 108–429; 19
8 U.S.C. 1629 note) is amended by adding at the end the
9 following:

10 “(c) **AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH IBLAS AT BLUE**
11 **WATER BRIDGE CONNECTING PORT HURON, MICHIGAN,**
12 **AND POINT EDWARD, ONTARIO, CANADA.**—Using the au-
13 thority granted by this section and under section 629 of
14 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1629), the Commis-
15 sioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection of the De-
16 partment of Homeland Security, in consultation with the
17 Canadian Customs and Revenue Agency, is authorized to
18 seek to establish Integrated Border Inspection Areas on
19 each side of the Blue Water Bridge connecting Port
20 Huron, Michigan, and Point Edward, Ontario, Canada.”.
