Mr. DAVIS of Kentucky introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

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## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to enter into an agreement with the Center for the Study of the Presidency to study reforms of the national security interagency system.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Interagency Reform

5       Study Act of 2007”.

1 **SEC. 2. STUDY OF NATIONAL SECURITY INTERAGENCY SYS-**2 **TEM.**

3 (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—Not later than 30 days after  
4 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of  
5 Defense shall enter into an agreement with the Center for  
6 the Study of the Presidency (in this section referred to  
7 as the “Center”) to conduct a study on the national secu-  
8 rity interagency system.

9 (b) REPORT.—The agreement entered into under  
10 subsection (a) shall require the Center to submit to Con-  
11 gress and the President a report containing the results  
12 of the study conducted pursuant to such agreement and  
13 any recommendations for changes to the national security  
14 interagency system (including legislative or regulatory  
15 changes).

16 (c) SUBMISSION DATE.—The agreement entered into  
17 under subsection (a) shall require the Center to submit  
18 the report required under subsection (b) not later than  
19 180 days after the date on which the Secretary makes  
20 funds appropriated pursuant to subsection (e) available to  
21 the Center.

22 (d) NATIONAL SECURITY INTERAGENCY SYSTEM DE-  
23 FINED.—In this section, the term “national security inter-  
24 agency system” means the structures, mechanisms, and  
25 processes by which the departments, agencies, and ele-  
26 ments of the Federal Government that have national secu-

1      rity missions integrate their policies, capabilities, exper-  
2      tise, and activities to accomplish such missions.

3                (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
4      authorized to be appropriated \$7,000,000 for fiscal year  
5      2008 to carry out this section.

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
