A BILL

To prevent any individual who has been convicted of a sexual offense involving a minor from serving in the Department of the Interior or the Department of Agriculture.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Preventing the
- 5 Endangerment of Children on Recreational Lands by Sex-
- 6 ual Violators Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. RESTRICTION.
- 8 (a) In General.—An individual convicted by a Fed-
- 9 eral, State, or local court of competent jurisdiction of a

- 1 sexual offense involving a minor shall not, after the date
- 2 as of which that conviction becomes or became final, be
- 3 eligible to serve in the Department of the Interior or the
- 4 Department of Agriculture, including on a contract basis.
- 5 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Nothing in this section shall re-
- 6 quire the separation of any employee serving pursuant to
- 7 an appointment that took effect, or an individual whose
- 8 services under contract began, before the date of the en-
- 9 actment of this Act.
