A BILL

To prohibit a State from imposing a discriminatory commuter tax on nonresidents, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSING DISCRIMINATORY**

4 **COMMUTER TAX ON NONRESIDENTS.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—A State may not impose a tax on
6 the income earned in the State by nonresidents unless the
7 tax is of substantial equality of treatment for the citizens
8 of the State and the nonresidents so commuting.

1 (b) STATE.—For purposes of subsection (a), the term
2 “State” includes the District of Columbia and any political
3 subdivision of a State.
