A BILL

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pay Veterans First
- 5 Act".

1	SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON PAYMENT OF SALARIES AND PER
2	FORMANCE BONUSES TO CERTAIN OFFICERS
3	OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
4	(a) Limitation on Payment of Bonuses.—For
5	fiscal year 2007, no bonus described in subsection (b) may
6	be paid to any officer of the Department of Veterans Af-
7	fairs who is appointed by the President, by and with the
8	consent of the Senate, or who is a senior politically ap-
9	pointed officer unless, at the time such payment is made
10	fewer than 100,000 claims for disability compensation
11	under chapter 11 of title 38, United States Code, are
12	pending before the Department.
13	(b) Bonuses Described.—A bonus described in
14	this subsection is any of the following:
15	(1) A performance award under section 5384 of
16	title 5, United States Code.

19	(c) Definition of Senior Politically Ap-
20	POINTED OFFICER.—For purposes of this section, the
21	term "senior politically appointed officer" means any offi-

23	(1) as an Assistant Secretary;
24	(2) as a Deputy Under Secretary:

1	(3) in a Senior Executive Service position and
2	is not a career appointee as defined under section
3	3132(a)(4) of title 5, United States Code; or

- (d) Comptroller General Reports.—For any 8 fiscal quarter of fiscal year 2007 during which the per-10 centage of claims for disability compensation processed by the Department of Veterans Affairs that are disallowed 11 12 exceeds the percentage that is 10 percent higher than the percentage of such claims that were disallowed during fis-14 cal year 2006, the Comptroller General shall conduct an 15 audit of the Department's processing of such claims to determine the reason for the increase in the percentage of 16 disallowed claims and, not later than 30 days after the last day of that fiscal quarter, shall submit to Congress 18 the results of such audit.
